## Tipton Site of Junior Show June 12-13

The Cedar County Fairgrounds in Tipton is the site of this year's Iowa Junior Hereford Show sponsored by the Iowa Junior Hereford Association.

Entry packets have been mailed to all IJHA members and entry deadline (postmark) is **May 22**. No late entries will be accepted.

Cattle must be in place by 10 a.m. on Saturday, June 12. Following check-in, a speech contest will be held at 3:30 p.m., with four age divisions - peewee, junior, intermediate and senior.

New officers and directors will be elected at the IJHA membership meeting, to be held after the speech contest. The Cedar County Cattlemen will serve a meal on Saturday night for a \$5 per person donation. A concession stand will be on the grounds both Saturday and Sunday.

The show will start at 8 a.m. on Sunday, June 13, beginning with cow-calf pairs. See the next column for show order and lodging information. As a special incentive, the Iowa Hereford Breeders Association will reimburse the entry fee of any heifer purchased in the 2010 Iowa Select Hereford Sale and shown at the IJHA preview show.

**No cattle will be released until the conclusion of the show.**

All Hereford enthusiasts are encouraged to attend this event to support the fine young people who represent the future of our breed.

At its March 14 meeting, the board of directors of the Iowa Hereford Breeders Association took the following actions:

- Approved drafting and sending a letter to the Iowa Beef Breeds Council requesting clarification of the rules regarding breeding soundness exams for bulls consigned to the Beef Expo.
- Voted to send a letter to the Iowa Junior Beef Breeds Association, IBBC representatives and the Beef Expo director, expressing concerns about the disqualifications of polled and horned heifers during the Iowa Junior Beef Expo, asking for specific corrective actions to be taken in the future and also requesting letters of apology to the IHBA and all junior exhibitors entered in the horned and polled Hereford shows.
- Approved a Nov. 1 deadline for listings and advertising in the 2011-2012 IHBA membership directory.
- Voted to raise dues to \$50 for the 2011 year.

## AHA Director Notes

Greetings to my friends in Iowa! I hope this note finds everyone in good spirits after a beautiful spring. In Wisconsin, we have been getting timely rains but yet had sufficient time to get our crops in. The calving season has been going well and the pastures are in great shape. I hope this holds true for you.

Here is a couple of notes to have you catch up with the happenings and give you a “heads up” for what will be happening in the Hereford breed:

**Updated Strategic Plan:** At our April AHA board meeting, the AHA board had the opportunity to review and update the AHA strategic plan. This was a very informative session. In advance of the meeting, surveys were taken from the AHA membership and Vance publishing conducted a survey through their Doane’s e-news. Craig Huffhines gave you an insight of the Vance survey in the last *Hereford World*. In summary, the Hereford breed is in a position to recapture market share in the commercial sector. Now it is up to the breeders to offer the type of cattle that the commercial breeder wants. The ball is in your court! Watch for more information about this strategic planning session in the next issues of the *Hereford World*.

**Fund Raising Auction for the Hereford Research Foundation:** During the strategic planning session it was obvious that the AHA has many opportunities but yet many challenges. The AHA can bring a tremendous message to the commercial cattlemen but it will take research money to show our point. At this time, the AHA has limited resources to do this research. One of the opportunities that the AHA

has for funding these projects is the **Hereford Research Foundation**. This foundation has been established especially for promoting research for the Hereford breed. ## Hall of Famer Elden Lenth Dies in March

Hall of Fame breeder Elden Lenth of Postville died March 11 at 81 years of age.

Elden began his farming career on the home farm near Monona, with a herd of Holstein cows from his 4-H days. He bought a farm southeast of Postville in 1954 and purchased his first registered Hereford cows in 1968, selling the dairy herd to his son-in-law.

His love of Herefords resulted in many awards on the local, state and national level. In addition to the IHBA Hall of Fame, he had been Clayton County Cattleman of the Year and was awarded the Winneshiek County Pioneer Award and Junior Cattleman Supreme Sponsor. He enjoyed promoting Certified Hereford Beef and often used it to feed the ISU football team.

Elden is survived by his wife of 60 years, Bea; daughters Georgene Hatlevig of Lanesboro, MN, and Barbara Reynolds, Huntsville, MO; son Doug, Postville; five grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; four step-grandchildren; and one sister.

## Anita Calf Sale Held a Week Late

The annual Hereford-influence calf sale at the Anita Livestock Auction was postponed to Jan. 30 due to a crippling ice storm on Jan. 20. A good-sized consignment was offered by breeders from Iowa and Missouri.

Prices held steady on steers, but were somewhat weak on heifers. Black whitefaced calves brought premium prices.

## Standing-Room-Only For Expo Sale

Buyers who didn't arrive early were hard-pressed to find a seat for the Feb. 18 Iowa Select Hereford Sale at the Iowa Beef Expo. A huge crowd made short work of the 50-head consignment, sending the cattle into seven states and giving the breed the fourth best average of 12 breeds selling at the weeklong Expo.

According to figures recently released by the American Hereford Association, last year's Iowa Select Hereford Sale had some of the best averages of all consignment sales in the United States. 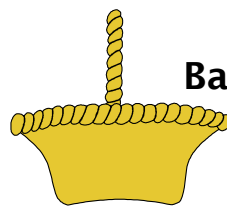

## **Juniors: Apply to “Win a Heifer”**

All juniors who are planning to exhibit at the Iowa State Fair (open show, 4-H or FFA) are urged to apply for the Iowa Beef Heifer Award sponsored by the IHBA and the Iowa State Fair and coordinated by the Iowa Cattlemen’s Association. Applications and entry deadline information are available at your local Extension office or from the Iowa Cattlemen’s Association.

The winner will receive up to \$700 to apply to the purchase of a Hereford heifer (minimum award is \$500 for a private treaty purchase from an IHBA member; \$600 if bought at the Beef Expo from an out-of-state consignor and \$700 if purchased at the Beef Expo from an Iowa breeder). Two runners-up will receive leather show halters.
