Preview Show is May 30-31 in Indianola

The Warren County Fairgrounds in Indianola will be the site of the 2026 Iowa Junior Hereford Association's Preview Show on May 30-31. Cattle may begin arriving at 7 a.m. on Saturday and must be on the grounds by noon. Exhibitors can check in any time after arrival, but must be checked in 1 p.m.

Junior activities yet to be announced will take place from 1-3 p.m., followed by an IJHA-sponsored ice cream social and membership meeting, where new officers will be elected. Evening activities were still in the planning stages at press time.

In a change from recent years, showmanship & cattle competitions will both be held on Sunday. The day's events begin at 8:30 a.m. with announcements and crowning of the 2026 Iowa Hereford Queen. Judge Colby Taber will begin placing cattle at 9:00 a.m. Show order will be cow/calf pairs, bulls, horned heifers, steers, polled heifers and supreme animal, with breaks for pictures with the judge after each of the grand champions. Showmanship will begin following the conclusion of the show with divisions for senior, intermediate, junior and peewee.

Mark Ohrt Inducted into Hall of Fame



One of the most-anticipated events at the IHBA' annual banquet during the Iowa Beef Expo is the Hall of Fame induction, which recognizes people who have had a significant impact on the breed in Iowa. This year's inductee, Mark Ohrt of Haverhill, has spent the last 50+ years not only raising and promoting Herefords in Iowa, but serving the breed, the association and its members every chance he gets.

As a teenager, Mark bought his first Polled Hereford heifer from his uncle, Iowa Hereford Hall of Famer Marvin Ohrt, for a 4-H project. His brother Merlin also had a calf from Uncle Marvin, who initiated the boys into the showing that summer at a prestigious SOP (Standard of Perfection) Polled Hereford show at the Iowa State Fair, where Mark's heifer won her class.

After that, he and Merlin bought heifer calves every year, mostly at the Hawkeye Polled Hereford Sale in Cedar Rapids, from McFarlands, Dittmers, Krugs and Downey Lane Farms – three of the four are also in the Hall of Fame. It wasn't long before he and Merlin began helping load out cattle from that sale – no small feat for two teenagers trying to push 1,600-1,800-lb. bulls up a ramp onto a straight truck, which was the main mode of livestock transport in those days. The brothers showed with Uncle Marvin at the All-Iowa Fair, Cattle Congress and Iowa State Fair for many years. His uncle and aunt's influence had such an impact on Mark's life that for three years beginning in 2017 he and the family awarded a \$750 scholarship in their memory to an Iowa junior.

The herd was first called Ohrt Brothers, then Leonard Ohrt & Sons and finally Ohrt Polled Herefords. At its peak in the 1980s, they had about 35 head. Early bloodlines were from Glenkirk Farms in Missouri, where Mark worked during college. Over the years, he has infused Cuda and Catapult breeding as well as a Houston son from Sandhill Farms. The farm is now home to 11 cows, the optimal number that can be sustained by the hay they raise.

In the late 1970's, Mark consigned to the B.O. Gammon Sale and later at the Iowa Beef Expo for many years. Today, bulls, bred cows and pairs are sold private treaty, but "if we have a really good one, we'll go to the Beef Expo." Mark has advertised in every IHBA directory since at least 2001 and uses it as his main advertising outlet. One of his proudest moments was selling a bull to a local country veterinarian.

From the get-go, Mark has been active in the Iowa Hereford community. He first hosted a tour stop for the Iowa Polled Hereford Association in the late 1980's and has welcomed the IHBA tour to his farm three other times – in 2003, 2013 and 2022. He was tour chairman twice, including 2022, when he stepped in at the last minute to organize the tour when original tour plans fell through.

Mark has served several terms on the boards of both the Iowa Polled Hereford and Iowa Hereford Breeders Associations. He was one of six "polled" members elected by the IPHA to serve on the first board of the IHBA when the horned and polled associations merged in 1999. He was one of two IHBA representatives to the Iowa Beef Breeds Council during the association's first three years and volunteered for numerous committees, including show & sale and scholarship. What he enjoyed most, he says, was working on the tours and Hall of Fame nominations, because that gave him the opportunity to meet and talk with a lot of breeder members.

He also gets to talk to a lot of people each year when he takes at least one shift in the Gammon Barn Museum during the State Fair. His dedication to the Barn has led him to join Brian Gabriel in overseeing the museum volunteers after Ray Dittmer's retirement last fall.

You can find Mark at nearly every event sponsored by the IHBA – the banquet, sale, tour – and the IJHA preview show. One of his most prominent volunteer roles for the last 30+ years has been in the ring during the open show at the Iowa State Fair, where he organizes and oversees the ribbons and banners and their presentations by the queen and princess. He has even filled in as “ribbon girl” when the royalty was unavailable (though he says he only wore the tiara once). He also keeps track of show placings and assists with awards points for premier breeder and exhibitor. He got the job by happenstance – he says he was chatting in the ring with Dan Dittmer and Tom Bowlin, who were breed superintendents, when they said they were looking for someone to write some things down. Mark said he sat down and started writing – and has been there ever since. But, “it’s the best seat in the house.”

An animal science graduate of Hawkeye Tech, Mark's off-the-farm employment has included longterm stints at the Maytag factory and a concrete plant; and he also builds houses. Bonnie, his wife of 40 years, has been an integral part of the cattle operation while also working as an insurance processor in Marshalltown and running Homespun Family, a family weaving business started with her grandmother and parents. She has generously donated items made from llama and alpaca wool to the IHBA as door prizes. In recent years, Bonnie has become a skilled, self-taught chainsaw sculptor.

The Ohrts have two grown children, daughter Casey Faircloth and son Wes Ohrt and three grandchildren. Wes recently re-entered the cattle business with Mark and the family is hoping to show at the state fair this summer for the first time in many years.

Mark is always willing to help with whatever needs to be done and is a great ambassador for the breed and IHBA. While he doesn't do it for the recognition, the IHBA is proud to give him his due as the newest member of its Hall of Fame.

The Gammon Barn Museum, located inside the historic structure that was home to the first Polled Herefords, showcases the history of the breed with many diverse exhibits. More than a thousand State Fair attendees stumble onto this hidden gem every year ("I didn't know this was here" is heard frequently) and rely on volunteer hosts to explain the significance of what they are seeing – and why it's worth braving an unairconditioned structure in the middle of August.

With the retirement last year of longtime museum curator/coordinator Ray Dittmer, the museum will be "under new management" in 2026. Brian Gabriel, who "interned" under Ray the last couple of years, and Mark Ohrt, who helps host every year, are sharing the oversight of the museum and its volunteers. In addition to volunteers to fill 22 half-day shifts over the 11-day run (Aug. 13-23) of the fair, they are also looking one or two people who would be willing to open and close the building and oversee volunteers for 2 or more days to allow them time to catch up with responsibilities at home.

All volunteers will receive an admission ticket to the fair and a voucher for parking in a home lot close to the fairgrounds.
